<u>Learning objectives:</u>	The objective of the course is to provide students with a framework for the understanding of Leadership from three different aspects: theoretical models of leadership, self-assessment of leadership and being a leader. Emphasis will be place upon effective leadership, formal leadership and peer leadership in diversified interdisciplinary teams. The student will learn to critically analyze their own and others' leadership styles and use tools designed to develop and improve their own leadership potential. A further objective is to provide the students with basic knowledge, experi- ence and guidance on their "leadership journey".
<u>Content:</u>	 At the conclusion of this course, the student should be able to: Understand various definitions and examples of leadership in the work context. Develop and improve personal leadership competencies based on self-analysis of leadership strengths and weaknesses. Understand the importance of personal values, commitment and responsibility in leadership of teams, groups and organizations Apply theories of leadership styles, visionary thinking, motivation, decision-making and team dynamics to understand how and why leadership works. Discuss how effective communication enhances negotiation skills, can drive momentum and help building organizational relationships. Determine how the human aspects respect, empathy, personality can contribute towards building interpersonal relationships within the teams and help in meeting team objectives, goals and results.



- Apply effective leadership techniques to assure a positive business outcome despite individual, cultural, interdisciplinary and/or organizational differences in heterogeneous teams/groups.
- Discuss possible solutions in challenging situations, in dealings with difficult personalities and behaviors and coping with failures.

Generate and maintaining a "knowledge-database" by conducting "lessons learned" discussions and integrate the learnings into future projects.
