



Before arriving in Germany Organize your Student Visa

Visa Application - as soon as possible!

- → International prospective students* need a visa. Non-EU citizens from socalled preferential countries are entitled to visa-free entry into Germany, <u>see website of the Federal Foreign Office</u>.
- → Learn more about student visa requirements

Blocked Account

- → A student visa can only be issued with a blocked minimum amount of money deposited in a German bank account : 11.208 Euro for one year or 934 Euro for one month
- → Further information about a blocked account
- \rightarrow Example blocked account provider: <u>Fintiba</u>.

*This excludes students from the European Union (EU), the European Economic Area (EEA) and Switzerland.

Request enrolment

→ A PDF will be generated including the bank details for paying the 85 EUR student union contribution (→ <u>online portal</u>)

Proof of payment

- \rightarrow Transfer student union contribution of 85 EUR
- \rightarrow Upload proof of payment to online portal

Get German public health insurance

- \rightarrow Contact an insurance provider, <u>learn more here</u>
- → Your insurance provider will send an electronic report (M10) directly to TH Rosenheim as a confirmation

Receive your student email address and the login credentials online
→ All further student services will be organized via your student email account and Online Service Center!

→ Check your accounts regularly!

Get your student ID card from the Student Administration Office (Studienamt) once you arrive on campus: identification, library, printing and scanning, cafeteria

Before arriving in Germany Find your Accommodation

Start looking for an apartment as soon as possible:

- → Housing market is tight, search actively!
- \rightarrow If you are offered a place in the student dorm: take it!
- Also look for short-term options for the first semester (boarding houses, interim rent)!

→ If necessary, stay in a hotel or with a friend/student.
→ Don't panic. Keep looking once you arrive in Germany.



Before arriving in Germany Find your Accommodation

Tips and notes

- → "Kaltmiete" = basic rent
- "Warmmiete" = basic rent + additional expenses such as heat, water and electricity ("NK/ "Nebenkosten")
- "Kaution" = deposit (1 or 2 "Kaltmieten") full refund after moving out
- Liability insurance and home contents insurance
 ("Haftpflichtversicherung, Hausratversicherung") covers
 unintended damage caused in the accommodation
- → Rental conditions and prices are not negotiable with landlords
- → "Makler" (real estate agents) don't pay them!



Before arriving in Germany Late Arrival

Lectures are held in presence on campus!

If you arrive late for the start of studies...

- → Inform your dean of studies and study coordinator
- → Sign up to your courses and keep up with the learning materials online in the Learning Campus

Make sure to arrive in Germany **not later than six weeks** after the start of studies. Remember to register for the exams for each module of the semester.

If you arrive **later than six weeks**, arrange an appointment with your dean of studies.



Before arriving in Germany Prepare your Travel Essentials

 \rightarrow Clothes for summer (+30 $^\circ\,$ C) and winter (-10 $^\circ\,$ C) in Germany!

 \rightarrow Documents:

- Original certificates
- Passport and visa (+ copies)
- Health insurance proof
- Biometric passport photos (+ copies)
- Admission letter by TH Rosenheim
- → Smartphone, tablet, laptop ...
- → If you arrive before the start of studies: additional travel health insurance until your student health insurance coverage starts (more)
- → Cash for the first month (currency is Euros), until your bank account is unblocked
- \rightarrow Medicine and prescriptions, if required

- → Academics: read your study plan and module handbook to see the workload and contents of the first semester
- → Language: free German and English language online courses → <u>OPEN vhb</u> Offers: <u>Technical English</u>, <u>German A1</u> up to C1



First Steps in Germany Arrival to TH Rosenheim

- → Closest Airport: Munich Airport (MUC) no pick-up service available
- → Schedule your travels in Germany with railway company Deutsche Bahn: use the app DB Navigator
- → Check the <u>Deutschland-Ticket</u>: monthly subscription to local and regional public transport services all over Germany – 29 EUR per month!

First Steps in Germany Registration



- → Get your student ID card from the <u>Student Administration</u> Office ("Studienamt") at TH Rosenheim
- → Collect your accommodation contract and health insurance card in Germany
- → Register your address ("Meldebescheinigung") at the Residents' Registration Office within two weeks after arrival (<u>find contacts here</u>)
- → Apply for a residence permit at the Immigration Office ("Ausländerbehörde") as soon as possible (<u>find contacts here</u>)
- → Set-up a **bank account**, e.g. Sparkasse

- → Semester break: 15 February 14 March


Summer Semester: 15 March - 31 July

- \rightarrow Different types of instructions: Vorlesung (lecture), Übung (exercise), Praktikum (practical unit)









Studying at TH Rosenheim of App Semester workload to expect

- Studying at TH Rosenheim makes you a full-time student.
- You have six study modules / semester; usually weekly classes
 → at least 24 hours of attendance on campus / week
- Additional preparation, follow-ups and homework outside of classes are necessary and expected!
- Each module closes with an examination at the end of the semester. To pass your exams, attend all classes and work on your assignments during the semester!
- Make your studies a priority: You must pass each exam at some point, there is no skipping or workaround.





Studying at TH Rosenheim of Balancing studies and work



- Go for basic student jobs (retail, production, hospitality...)
 → "Mini-Jobs" up to 538 EUR/month
- You can work full time during the semester breaks.
- Learning German is essential to get your first job.
- Go for student positions and internships later in your studies. First, companies want to see success in your studies and basic work experience!

Do not miss out! Keep the given deadlines!

- → Read and respond to e-mails: all communication goes through your student email inbox (...@stud.throsenheim.de) – no private e-mail accounts!
- → Sign-up to each module on Learning Campus: lecture slides, assignments, learning resources
- → Register for each module's exam during the exam registration period
- → Re-Register for the upcoming semester by paying the student union contribution




