General Campus Housing Information	It is the responsibility of the incoming student to arrange their own housing, whether oncampus or otherwise. The European University of the Atlantic will assist exchange students with on-campus housing requests however we cannot guarantee that their first preference will be allocated.  The new residence of the Universidad Europea del Atlántico, which is fully equipped and operational starting the 2017-2018 academic course, is located in the Scientific and Technological Park of Cantabria, just two hundred meters away from the campus, five hundred meters from a shopping mall and very well connected with downtown Santander. A
	bus line with a stop in the same street connects all these points fast and effectively, since the line frequency is high.  The residence counts with avant-garde facilities, which are comfortable, functional and designed with criteria for energy efficiency to meet the accommodation needs of professors, researchers and students.
