

■ **Information on applying for the Master's degree programme in
Advanced Industrial Engineering
at Rosenheim Technical University of Applied Sciences**

27. April 2023

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1. Admission requirements

Admission requirements for the Master's degree programme are a Bachelor's degree in the course of studies in industrial engineering, a corresponding technical-economically oriented course of studies or an engineering course of studies or an equivalent qualification obtained in Germany or abroad. An overall grade of "good" or higher is required.

The aim of the degree programme is to provide training for a globalised world with a strong intercultural understanding and an international perspective. This orientation is implemented through courses taught exclusively in English and thus addressing an international target audience.

2. Applications

Students can start their studies in the winter semester. Applications for the winter semester are possible in the period from 1 April to 15 June (start of studies 1 October).

Please be aware that it is in your own interest to submit your application as early as possible. You need to register online via our website www.th-rosenheim.de/studienbewerber.html. Here you can upload all the certificates and documents required for your application.

Please do not send us any postal applications - we are unable to consider any applications submitted by post (online application procedure)!

The following documents must be uploaded with your online application:

The following documents must be uploaded by no later than 15 Juni / 15 December:

- **The "curriculum vitae" form** (which is available to download during the online application).
- **Diploma or Bachelor's certificate from your first/undergraduate degree obtained in Germany**
(If you have not received your certificate yet, you can present your confirmation of grades as proof that you have successfully completed your first degree). You may need to upload a German or English translation produced by an officially appointed translator. It is essential that this shows the overall examination result! If you have not finished your first degree by the application deadline, please observe the information on the last page of this information sheet.
or
"uni-assist" preliminary review documentation, if necessary
(this applies if your first/undergraduate degree was NOT obtained at a German educational institution);

If you did not obtain your higher education entrance qualification at a German institution, you will need a valid VPD (Vorprüfungsdokumentation) from uni-assist. Uni-assist is then going to review your documents if they match the admission requirements for German universities. Please make sure to apply for either a Bachelor VPD (for a bachelor's degree programme) or a Master VPD (for a master's degree programme)! You will be able to apply to uni-assist from 1 September (summer semester) and 1 March (winter semester). Register with uni-assist. Upload your higher education entrance qualifications/school or university leaving certificates. Apply to TH Rosenheim with your valid VPD. Your VPD does not expire. TH Rosenheim will accept VPDs made out for other German universities or universities of applied sciences in the relevant field of studies.

- **Proof of English language skills**

Admission to the degree programme requires level B2 English language skills under the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). These can be evidenced by:

1. Internet-based TOEFL with 72 or more points
2. IELTS with a band score of 6.0 or higher
3. Cambridge CEFR B2 First (FCE), Grade C or higher

- 4. Cambridge CEFR C1 Advanced (CAE) with level B2 or higher
- 5. English-language Bachelor's degree

Native English-speaking applicants are not required to submit proof of adequate English language skills.

- **If available, a diploma supplement or transcript of records** as proof of the required number of ECTS credits. You do not have to provide this document if the ECTS credits are shown on the degree certificate. Applicants who studied for their first/undergraduate degree at Rosenheim Technical University of Applied Sciences do not need to submit this document.
- **If applicable, evidence of the grading system for your first degree**, including details of the highest and lowest possible pass grades (if this is different to the German grading system).
- **Proof of change of name, if necessary (e.g. marriage certificate)**

Please upload the following by enrolment at the latest (see letter of acceptance for deadline):

- **Reporting procedure for health insurance**
At the time of enrolment at the latest, we need an electronic report from your health insurance company about your insurance status (M10). Please contact your health insurance company about this – the earlier the better. Your health insurance company will then send the necessary report to us. Please provide them with our sender number H0000974.
- **Proof of payment of the student union contribution to the amount of € 85**
(account statements or screenshots showing transactions are suitable evidence of this proof)

After you have applied for enrolment via Rosenheim Technical University of Applied Sciences' online applicant portal, it will generate a PDF file for you where you can find the bank details for the student union contribution. Please make sure you state the transaction reference given here, otherwise we will not be able to allocate your payment to you!

Please wait until you receive confirmation of admission before transferring any payments.

- **Certificate of removal from the university register, if necessary**
with details of the university semester or study times (not necessary for applicants who studied/are studying at Rosenheim Technical University of Applied Sciences or for degrees outside of Germany).
- **Certificate of higher education entrance qualification obtained at a German, Austrian or Swiss educational institution in German or English language**
- **For applicants from India: Certificate of the Academic Evaluation Center (APS)**
- **Potentially for war refugees who are unable to provide evidence of their German skills in time:** Evidence of a residence permit in accordance with Section 24 of the Residence Act (e.g. a copy of the card issued by the immigration authorities (Ausländerbehörde)

3. Information for applicants from non-EU countries abroad

Please send your applications in early, as experience has shown that the application procedure for a residence permit takes several weeks. You can find information about housing options online here: www.th-rosenheim.de/housing.

4. Information for war refugees

War refugees who have a residence permit in accordance with Section 24 of the Residence Act (Act on the Residence, Economic Activity and Integration of Foreigners in the Federal Territory) can submit the evidence of sufficient German language skills later, by the 2nd semester.

War refugees who have a residence permit in accordance with Section 24 of the Residence Act (Act on the Residence, Economic Activity and Integration of Foreigners in the Federal Territory) can also submit a DAAD language certificate (English B2) from TH Rosenheim's Language Centre as evidence of sufficient English language skills. 5. Further procedure

If you are accepted, you must apply for enrolment in the online applicant portal and upload the missing documents indicated there by 31 August. If you apply to multiple degree programmes, please apply for enrolment for only one programme.

If someone is authorised (in writing) to represent you, please inform this person of the importance of the deadlines! Negligence by an authorised representative will lead to you being excluded from the procedure, just as your own negligence would.

If you have applied for enrolment in the online applicant portal by 31 August (study start winter semester) or 28 February (study start summer semester) and Student Administration has all the required documents (processing status in the online applicant portal: "Enrolment application in progress") you will receive your study documents in the mail. There is no need to enrol in person.

6. What should you do if you have not yet completed your first degree by the time the semester starts?

In this case, on the day of registration, Student Administration will send you temporary guest access for all online services at Rosenheim Technical University of Applied Sciences. Please get in touch with Student Administration once your overall examination result has been announced to find out about enrolment.

Enrolment will need to be denied if the first degree has not been completed by the date of the first examination in the Master's degree. Completed means that the final overall examination result must have been submitted!

Important note for applicants who have gained at least 180 ECTS credits but not more than 210 ECTS credits in their first/undergraduate degree:

In order to pass the Master's examination, proof must be provided of the missing credits, or they must be caught up from the range of relevant courses at Rosenheim Technical University of Applied Sciences. The Examination Committee shall determine which courses and examinations need to be taken additionally in the degree programme. In some cases, relevant vocational or professional work periods may be credited to the missing ECTS credits. Proof of a total of 300 ECTS credits (incl. first course of studies) is therefore required to successfully obtain your degree qualification. Applicants with fewer than 180 ECTS credits from their first degree cannot be admitted to the Masters' degree programme.
